NEED TO APPLY SANCTIONS/REWARDS ON IGR PERFORMANCE

It has been observed that in spite of the encouragement and advice for Ministries, Departments and Agencies (MDAs) to double efforts on revenue generation, not much has been achieved. Rather, the revenue profile is experiencing a decline. This trend of revenue generation has a negative effect on the operations of government and it's not *in tandem* with the desire of the present administration to improve on fiscal performance and consolidate on the achievements of the past four upon In view of the need to tap all sources of revenue generation, especially internally, to enable Government have more funds to prosecute its laudable programmes and projects, sanctions/rewards as appropriate, have been introduced for revenue generation performance in all the MDAs in the State.
Accounting Officers of all MDAs are, therefore, implored to note that achieving revenue targets will henceforth serve as a determinant for release of monthly Running Grants and consideration of other financial requests by
